



American College of Health Care Administrators

PREAMBLE: The preservation of the highest standards of integrity and ethical principles is vital to the successful discharge of the professional responsibilities of all longterm health care administrators. This Code of Ethics has been promulgated by the American College of Health Care Administrators (ACHCA) in an effort to stress the fundamental rules considered essential to this basic purpose. It shall be the obligation of members to seek to avoid not only conduct specifically proscribed by the code, but also conduct that is inconsistent with its spirit and purpose. Failure to specify any particular responsibility or practices. Recognizing that the ultimate responsi-bility for applying standards and ethics falls upon the individual, the ACHCA establishes the following Code of Ethics to make clear its expectation of the membership.

Expectation I

Individuals shall hold paramount the welfare of persons for whom care is provided. PRESCRIPTIONS: The Health Care Administrator shall:

- •Strive to provide to all those entrusted to his or her care the highest quality of appropriate services possible in light of resources or other constraints.

- •Consistent with law and professional standards, protect the confidentiality of information regarding individual recipients of care.
- •Perform administrative duties with the personal integrity that will earn the confidence, trust, and respect of the general public.
- •Take appropriate steps to avoid discrimination on basis of race, color, religion, sex, pregnancy, sexual orientation, citizenship status, national origin, age, physical or mental disability, past, present or future status in the U.S. uniformed services, genetics or any other char•Provide services other than those for which verse impact on the facility or its residents. acteristic protected under applicable law.

PROSCRIPTION: The Health Care Administrator to the best interest of the profession. shall not:
