The Facility Assessment is a component of Phase 2 that will be implemented beginning November 28, 2017. If utilized properly, the Facility Assessment can become a key to strategic planning and improving your facilities position in the marketplace, strengthening your current service offerings through training and competency-based programs and it can identify opportunities for new clinical programming.

Under the revised RoP, SNFs must ensure that staff are able to demonstrate competency in the skills and techniques necessary to care for residents' needs. This session will focus on preparing SNF teams to effectively conduct a Facility Assessment and accurately identify the resources and skills needed to care for their resident populations, review useful tools and resources to assist in the development of clinical competencies, and discuss methods of sustaining facility improvements through a QAPI approach.

Resources to develop the type of care and service needed to address issues of long-standing-mental disorders, substance use, addictions, and other behavioral-health needs are in short supply. This session offers a variety of ideas for anticipating and developing common-sense approaches to these contemporary challenges. Improving staff education and training in behavioral health and developing strategies to address common symptoms and reactions in mental health are a focus of this conversation.

8:30AM - 10:00AM CMS CHANGES FOR 2018: PREPARING FOR THE FUTURE OF LTC

This session is geared toward clinicians and will review the changes CMS has planned for 2018 and beyond. CMS announced that they intend to add 62 new items to the MDS assessment on 10/1/18. Attendees will learn what upcoming changes are in store for Medicare and MDS and how to best prepare for them, including a new reimbursement system. Participants will also gain knowledge on the QAPI process and how to optimize QAPI efforts in order to improve facility rankings and monitor ongoing improvement.

11:00AM – 12:30PM CMS FINAL RULE PHARMACY SERVICES UPDATE: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW!

In this session, Dr. Hallett will review the recently released update of the "State Operations Manual Appendix PP," which was implemented in CMS's Phase 2 rollout of the regulatory reform of the Medicare and Medicaid Requirements for Participation Final Rule. He will specifically highlight important aspects of the Guidance to Surveyors in the newly renumbered F-Tags for Pharmacy, as well as touch on the role of the consultant pharmacist in antibiotic stewardship as highlighted in the guidance document.

SPEAKER: DR. WILLIAM HALLETT, Pharm. D, MBA

Dr. Hallett founded Guardian Consulting

Services, Inc., which is dedicated to providing consultant pharmacist services to nursing homes, adult-day programs, assisted-living facilities, and group homes for the disabled. His company currently provides clinical-consultant pharmacist services for more than 40,000 patients in over 250 healthcare facilities and programs throughout the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic.

1:30PM – 3:00PM PERSON-CENTERED CARE

Person-centered care is care that is customized based on needs and values of the person served, and it is a component of the Requirements of Participation for skilled-nursing facilities and long-term care. Creating a culture of person-centered care provides the resident choice and control over his/her daily life.

This presentation will provide insights into establishing an organizational culture of person-centered care. Transitioning from a traditional culture to a culture of caring will be discussed, in addition to providing specific strategies for implementing person-centered care through nine elements of culture change. The presentation will also include strategies for success and lessons from the hospitality industry that can be applied to the healthcare setting.

SPEAKER: KRIS MASTRANGELO

Kris Mastrangelo is president and CEO of Harmony Healthcare International, a nationally - recognized healthcare consulting firm specializing in C.A.R.E. 4:00PM - 5:30PM MEDICARE REIMBURSEMENT UPDATE: RCS-I

The new Medicare Part A payment system is targeted for implementation on October 1, 2018. This is not a "refinement" as we've experienced in the past. The Resident Classification System adds significant complexity, with five distinct payment domains including a diagnosis-driven therapy component and length-of stay-weighted per diem rates. Mastering the system will require facilitywide changes in care management and documentation. This program will provide early insight into the most significant payment reform in 20 years. Presenters will also review new regulations specific to the MDS, SNF value-based pur-

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chasing, alternative-payment models and reimbursement penalties.

SPEAKERS: SHERYL ROSENFIELD, RN AND MARC ZIMMET

Sheryl Rosenfield has been active in the national SNF community for over 30 years. She is a member of the Health Care Compliance Association's Long-Term-Care Committee, working with representatives throughout the United States on protocols and policies effecting medical review and payment concerns. As a trainer of the MDS since 1990, she was a founder of AANAC, a national organization serving over 15,000 members associated with the assessment and care processes in skilled-nursing facilities. Sheryl has worked with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) on multiple projects, including serving on the Technical Expert Panel to evaluate the implementation and impact of the RUG PPS on SNFs. She was a member of the clinical-standardsand-training team for the federal DAVE project and served as a Data Monitor for the federal STRIVE project. She also served as an "MDS 3.0 Manual" reviewer and continues to contribute to that project.

Marc Zimmet entered the skilled-nursing industry in 1993, at the onset of the national "sub-acute" care movement. Medicare costreport appeals were a key component of a successful short-term rehabilitation program, and Zimmet & Company (the precursor to ZHSG) quickly emerged as a national leader in the space. As skilled- nursing facilities transitioned to prospective payment in the late 1990's, Mr. Zimmet applied his experience from New York State's participation in the Nursing Home Case-Mix & Quality Demonstration project to develop early reimbursement-compliance-management strategies for his clients. He now leads the even more challenging transition to valuebased/alternative-payment and managed care.

Recognizing the market and regulatory changes transforming the healthcare landscape, Marc structured the firm's "Advanced Healthcare Initiatives" program in 2015. His vision has been realized through the four Zimmet Healthcare "spectrum" companies, establishing the firm as a leader in SNF data analytics, care management/transitions technology and outsourced case management.

8:15AM – 9:45AM IMPROVING FINANCIAL AND CLINICAL OUTCOMES WITH INTEGRATED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Successful integration of behavioral-health services has become indispensable to survival

in the SNF environment. Achieving outstanding short-term rehabilitation outcomes, avoiding rehospitalizations and staying in compliance with psychotropic-drug regulations around require state-of-the-art psychiatric and psychological care woven into overall medical care.

The appropriate management of psychiatric concerns with evidence-based treatment has always been essential to a facility's ability to operate within the regulatory environment while maintaining an attractive climate for residents, families and staff. But modern SNFs are confronted by new imperatives that will require fundamental shifts in care in order to avoid potentially devastating consequences.

Case studies and clinical presentations will highlight effective strategies for implementing evidence-based GDRs, non-pharmacologic interventions for managing difficult behaviors, clinical protocols for avoiding re-hospitalizations, and other essential ideas for succeeding in the current regulatory and financial landscape.

SPEAKER: DR. RICHARD JUMAN


